Growing a Brighter Future for Canada through Environmental Education & Career Pathways

In 2025, PLT Canada advanced our work to provide a lifetime of learning through environmental education, forest literacy, and career pathways. This work is critical to grow a skilled and inclusive workforce for Canada's forest and conservation sector, and invest in a forest literate society. Looking back on this year, I am proud of what we have achieved together with our partners across government, industry, Indigenous communities, conservation groups, Parks agencies, educational institutions, and youth organizations. Our work is helping to strengthen the natural resource sector, support climate action, and build economic resilience for communities across the country, especially as the sector faces unprecedented challenges.

When we invest in youth employment, we invest in the future strength of our communities and our natural resource economy. In 2025, we supported 470 Green Jobs, providing 55% of placements to women and 24% to Indigenous youth, thanks to support from the Government of Canada and the Government of Ontario. Thanks to our network of over 470 employers, we have now supported more than 8,700 Green Jobs since 2018. We are especially excited to have launched our first Ontario-specific career pathways program to support the forest products sector, including offering Green Jobs, mentorship, skills training, employer training, and a virtual career fair.

Mentorship continued to be a cornerstone of our workforce strategy. This year, we supported 135 participants in three mentorship cohorts. Mentorship helps young people build confidence, explore career options, and stay connected to meaningful work in the sector. I was also proud to see more than 35 young professionals participate as youth delegates at the Sustainable Forestry Initiative Annual Conference, where they connected with employers, expanded their networks, and explored career paths.

The future of our forests depend on the public understanding the benefits of sustainably managed forests. In 2025, PLT Canada expanded forest education and literacy across Canada. We provided training and resources to over 450 educators in six provinces, helping them bring nature-based learning into classrooms and communities. We are proud to have partnered with several universities to provide training to pre-service teachers, worked with youth-serving organizations, collaborated with leading environmental NGOs through the Nature Education Collective, delivered educator training at schools, including the first Indigenous Charter School in Canada, and more.

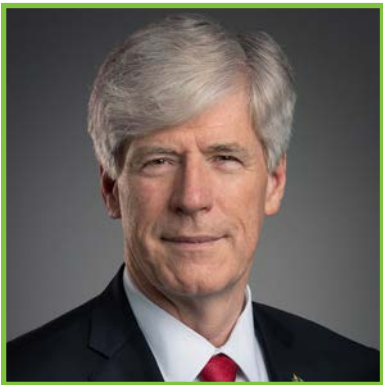

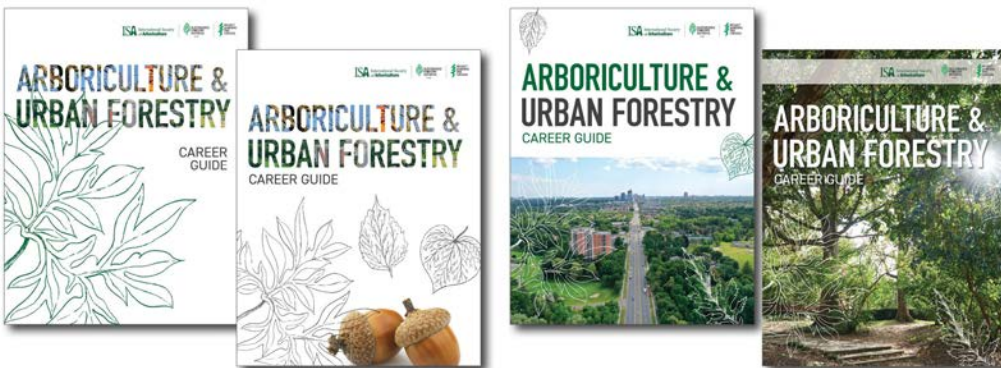
INTERNATIONAL SOCIETY OF ARBORICULTURE (ISA)

PLT CANADA'S PARTNERSHIPS

ONTARIO MINISTRY OF NATURAL RESOURCES (OMNR)

With support from OMNR, we offered 6 workshops to pre- and in-service teachers. Students at the University of Ottawa and the University of Toronto will be able to embed PLT Canada throughout their careers.

In-service teachers from Ottawa Carleton District School Board, Ottawa Catholic School Board, Keewatin Patricia District School Board, and the Council of Outdoor Educators of Ontario all increased their knowledge of Environmental Education through PLT Canada.



ONTARIO SKILLS DEVELOPMENT FUND (SDF) TRAINING STREAM

PLT Canada received funding from the Ontario SDF Training Stream to help young adults from underrepresented communities pursue careers in Ontario's forest-products sector. The careers program combines work experiences, mentorship, career readiness training, and employer engagement to promote inclusive workplaces and prepare participants for in-demand roles in forestry and manufacturing.

Part of the program included the *Green Jobs Grow in Ontario: PLT Canada Virtual Career Fair* for young people interested in Ontario's forest sector.

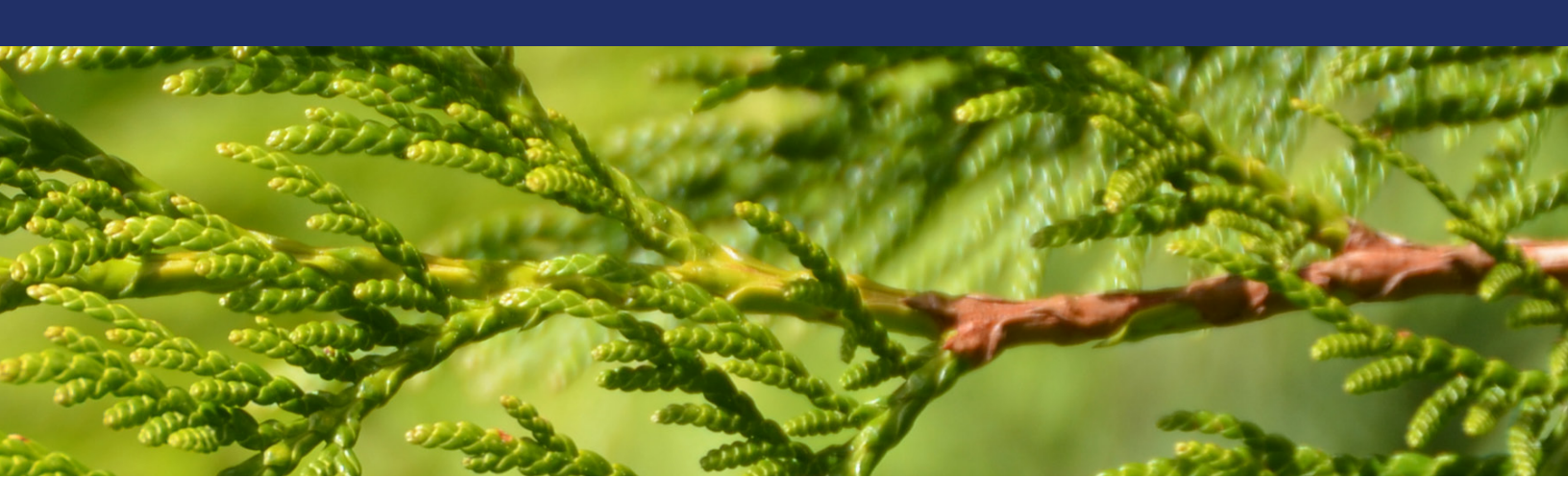

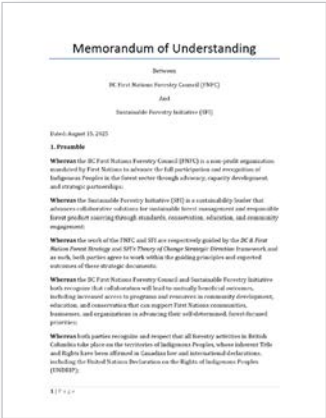

BC FIRST NATIONS FORESTRY COUNCIL

The BC First Nations Forestry Council and the Sustainable Forestry Initiative signed a Memorandum of Understanding to increase Indigenous leadership and participation in sustainable forest management. PLT Canada, an initiative of SFI, will collaborate with the BC First Nations Forestry Council on capacity development and supporting training, mentorship, and workforce development opportunities.



OUTLAND YOUTH EMPLOYMENT PROGRAM



PLT Canada also worked with OYEP in both Ontario and British Columbia to deliver Forest Week Programming to 30 Indigenous youth. BC First Nations Forestry Council partnered with PLT Canada to deliver the program to the BC camp for the first time. Youth discovered exciting green jobs and participated in skill-building activities, reviewing how to maximize their job search, networking strategies, and elevator pitches.
